SUN & HEAT SAFETY

Be alert and aware of the heat effects :
Heat can be dangerous when it reaches 100 degrees during the day and stays above 80 at night.
Follow these steps to stay safe & healthy when it's hot:

- Stay indoors and out of the sun during the day
- Fans alone won't protect you from extreme heat. Use your air conditioner
- If your indoor temperature remains above 90 degrees, seek shelter in an air-conditioned building
- Drink plenty of water, and eat lighter meals
- Avoid alcoholic or caffeinated drinks
- Take frequent cool showers or baths
- Check on the elderly or ill & bring pets indoors
- Wear light colored & loose-fitting clothing & a hat

Save Our WATER

City Staff continues to "flush" hydrants throughout the City. This is done to remove sediment from the water pipes to maintain water clarity and quality in the water distribution system. Although it may appear that water is being wasted, this process is part of a routine maintenance program necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system allowing the City to continue to deliver the highest quality water possible to our customers.

The City's water distribution system is a complex network of pipes and storage and storage reservoirs where sediment or deposits may naturally accumulate over time. If not removed, these materials may cause water quality deterioration, taste and odor problems or discoloration of water. Water may also stagnate in lesser used parts of the distribution system also resulting in degraded water quality.

Now that Summer is right around the corner here are some
Watering Conservation Tips:

1. Water in 5 minute cycles
2. Turn off the water while brushing your teeth
3. Wash only full loads in your washing machine
4. Take shorter showers
5. When washing dishes by hand, don't leave the water running
6. Don't run the hose while washing your car
7. Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants
8. Check for leaking pipes and faucets
9. Check for toilet leaks
10. Install low-flow shower heads



Don't forget to pay your Utility Bill by the last business day of the month to avoid a 10% penalty.
