



Figure 1. Monthly Trend of Average Response Time for Alarm Calls Over the year of 2018






UCR Part 1 - Rape




UCR Part 1 - Robbery




UCR Part 1 - Aggravated Assault




UCR Part 1 - Burglary




UCR Part 1 - Motor Vehicle Theft








